Sarsfield farm honoured with Award for Agri-Food Innovation Excellence

Congratulations to the Laplante family at Feather Weight Farm Inc. of Sarsfield, recipients of the regional award of the Premier's Award for 2014 Agri-Food Innovation Excellence.

At Feather Weight Farms, the new, automated traceability system it has implemented eliminates paper and keying errors. Printed bar codes and data guns make it simple to track each batch of chickens and transfer documents down the supply chain. At the same time, they cut the cost of recording flock data. If a recall was ever required, it would take a mere three hours - a fraction of the 24 hours required by a paper-based system. For Feather Weight owner Robert Laplante, his customers, and the consumers who enjoy his chicken, the system creates peace of mind all the way through the value chain.
