Rural well water drop-off schedule

Ottawa Public Health has established permanent sites across Ottawa where well owners can drop off their water samples and pick up new bottles for future testing. As part of the improved program, residents can now drop off their water samples **every Tuesday**, at one of these locations:

Midori Market, Sarsfield from 6 am to 9 pm. JT Bradley, Navan from 6:30 am to 8:30 pm. Orleans Client Service Centre from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. Peladeau Groceries, Vars from 8 am to 9 pm.

Residents wishing to drop off their samples and pick up testing bottles may also continue to do so during regular business hours at OPH's main office – Mary Pitt Centre (100 Constellation Drive) or at the Ontario Public Health Laboratory (2380 St. Laurent Blvd).
